St. Swithun's: Year 5/6 Curriculum Map - Spring Term - Rainforests

Major outcomes for the topic: Kensuke Flashback Story Multimedia Collage

English

Reading and Writing

In literacy we will be reading the story Kensuke's Kingdom by Michael Morpurgo and using reading skills to help us understand the characters and their motives. We will be making predictions throughout the book and justifying our answers using evidence from the text. We will then apply what we have learnt and strategies the author has used into diary writing and Newspaper Reports. We will aslo be writing a flashback story later in ther term. As part of this unit we will be learning how to edit and adapt our work as we are writing.

Grammar

We will be using a range of clause structures in our writing and learning about how to create effective expanded noun phrases for detail.

We will also be using brackets, dashes and commas for parenthesis.

Mathematics

In maths we will be measuring and identifying a range of different angles. This will include looking at acute, obtuse and reflex angles and learning how to draw and measure angles using a protractor. We will then move onto looking at angles as part of the interior of shapes, around a point and on a straight line. We will also be calculating the circumference and perimeter of circles and learning about the area and perimeter of a variety of shapes. We will also be finding percentages of amounts and relating percentages to fractions and decimals. During our Mental Maths we will be learning different strategies to solve calculations involving multiplication and division.

Science

During Science we will be learning about evolution and inheritance. We will identify how plants and animals have adapted or the years to suit their envorionment. We will also be looking at how those adaptations can lead to evolution within a species. We will look closely at fossils and what we can learn from them and

History

Geography focus for this half term.

During this topic, we will be studying the work of Sci Scott and using this as inspiration for our multi-media drawings.
