Each day your child will be doing phonics, literacy, numeracy and art activities which will take place both inside and outside. We will also visit the playtrail most days!

New Morning Routine

On Monday 12th November, we will be asking you to let your child walk into school from the main gate with the rest of the school. We have spoken to their Year Six Buddies and they are very keen to help! Their Buddies will be on hand every morning to walk them through to their playground where a teacher will greet them. Early Years staff will also be on the gate for the first few weeks until they are used to this new routine.





Helping at Home

It would be really helpful if you can encourage your child to dress and undress on their own in the morning. This includes doing their own socks and shoes. Our PE days are Tuesday and Thursday; so if they can wear clothing they find easy to change in and out of on these days, like socks instead of tights, it would be much appreciated.

Reading books!

Thank you all for supporting reading at home. As you will be aware your child has a regular reading day when they will be heard at school, in addition to this day they will also be heard by volunteers and EY staff throughout the week so please make sure they have their reading books every day. When we hear your child read we will always write in their diary but please don't feel you have to do the same. Some parents like to write the date they hear their child read, others write in there just when they have a question or if their child has read particularly well, others like to write in there every time they hear their child read, please do what you feel comfortable with. We recommend you hear your child 3-4 times a week, as well as reading to them (a range of books) as often as possible.

The reading workshop on Thursday 22nd November will offer more advice on how you can support your child at home.
